

Asbestos	Control of Asbestos Regulations 2012 (S.I. 2012/632).	The Regulations provide the framework for the management of Asbestos, ranging from provisions for building owners to those removing it or analysing samples which may contain asbestos fibres.
Boreholes	Borehole Sites and Operations Regulations 1995 (S.I. 1995/2038)	The Regulations apply to the safety of extraction operations at borehole sites for oil, natural gas, coal bed methane or other minerals.
Confined spaces	Confined Spaces Regulations 1997 (S.I. 1997/1713).	The Regulations protect employees from the risks of working in confined spaces.
Construction	Construction (Design and Management) Regulations 2015 (S.I. 2015/51).	The Regulations cover the management of health, safety and welfare when carrying out construction projects.
COSHH	Control of Substances Hazardous to Health Regulations 2002 (S.I. 2002/2677).	The Regulations make arrangements for controlling the risk to worker and others health from exposure to substances hazardous to health.
COSHH	Control of Substances Hazardous to Health (Amendment) Regulations 2003 (S.I. 2003/978).	The Regulations introduced a definition of a mutagen and added a number of substances to a list of carcinogens.
COSHH	Control of Substances Hazardous to Health (Amendment) Regulations 2004 (S.I. 2004/3386).	These Regulations restrict the use of Chromium VI - the requirement in the EU Directive; Introduce workplace exposure limits for hazardous substances, and principles for risk control - domestic provisions; Extends circumstances in which certain health and safety legislation is disapplied to ships - domestic provision.
COSHH	Acetylene Safety (England and Wales and Scotland) Regulations 2014 (S.I. 2014/1639)	The Regulations apply to the manufacture, importation, sale, use and transportation of liquid, solid and compressed acetylene gas as well as the compression of that gas and the filling of cylinders with this gas by means of a series of defined duties, safety and licensing requirements.
COSHH	Classification, Labelling and Packaging of Chemicals (Amendments to Secondary Legislation) Regulations 2015/21	The Regulations amend or revoke previous regulations. The introduction of the GHS by CLP15 removed barriers to trade that would otherwise exist due to the use of several worldwide classification systems and received significant support.

Display Screens	Health and Safety (Display Screen Equipment) Regulations 1992 (S.I. 1992/2792).	The Regulations implement European Directive 90/270/EEC on minimum health and safety requirements for work with Display Screen Equipment (DSE).
Equipment	Provision and Use of Work Equipment Regulations 1998 (S.I. 1998/2306).	The Regulations impose health and safety requirements with respect to the provision and use of work equipment.
Explosives	Dangerous Substances and Explosive Atmospheres Regulations 2002 (S.I. 2002/2776).	The Regulations eliminate or reduce risks to safety from fire, explosion or other events arising from the hazardous properties of a “dangerous substance” in connection with work.
Explosives	Explosives Regulations 2014 (S.I. 2014/1638).	The Regulations provide for the safe manufacture, storage and acquisition of explosives by means of a series of defined duties, the granting of approvals and a system of licensing, conformity assessment and market surveillance.
Explosives	Explosives Regulations 2014 (Amendment) Regulations 2016 (S.I. 2016/315).	The Regulations implement the recast Directive which improved safety, security and the market surveillance regime and clarified economic operator duties for civil use explosives.
First Aid	Health and Safety (First-Aid) Regulations 1981 (S.I. 1981/917).	The Regulations require employers to provide adequate and appropriate equipment and facilities for their employees, should they be injured or become ill at work.
Gas	Gas Safety (Installation and Use) Regulations 1998 (S.I. 1998/2451).	The Regulations protect the public and ensure consumer safety when having gas appliances fitted or serviced in their homes and commercial premises. These regulations focus on gas safety, engineer competence, the requirement for engineers to be (Gas Safe) registered and requirements of landlords and employers to maintain gas safety and builders not to affect gas safety.
Gas	The Gas Safety (Installation and Use) (Amendment) Regulations 2018 (S.I. 2018/139)	The Regulations revised the Gas Safety (Installation and Use) Regulations (GSIUR) 1998. They introduced flexibility to landlords' annual gas safety checks; exempted premises where gas is taken from the mains for compressing/dispensing to compressed natural gas (CNG) powered vehicles; and regularised existing exemption on alternative safety checks.
Height	Work at Height Regulations 2005 (S.I. 2005/735).	The Regulations set out requirements for the management of risks from working at height.
Height	Work at Height (Amendment) Regulations 2007 (S.I. 2007/114).	The Regulations apply the Work at Height Regulations 2005 to those who provide instruction and leadership to others in connection with their engagement in caving or climbing for sport, recreation, team building or similar activities.

Lead	Control of Lead at Work Regulations 2002 (S.I. 2002/2676).	The Regulations make arrangements for controlling the risk to worker and others health from exposure to lead at work.
Liability	Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974 (Civil Liability) (Exceptions) Regulations 2013 (S.I. 2013/1667).	The Regulations implement provisions of the Pregnant Workers Directive 1992 and the Agency Workers Directive 2008 in respect of pregnant women and new or breastfeeding mothers
Lifting	Lifting Operations and Lifting Equipment Regulations 1998 (S.I. 1998/2307).	The Regulations place duties on people and companies who own, operate or have control over lifting equipment.
Major Hazards	Control of Major Accident Hazards Regulations 2015 (S.I. 2015/483).	The Regulations ensure that duty holders take all necessary measures to prevent major accidents with hazardous substances and aim to mitigate the impact on people and the environment of large scale accidents which may occur.
Management	Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999 (S.I. 1999/3242).	The Regulations require employers to have arrangements in place to manage health and safety at work, including carrying out risk assessments, making arrangements to implement necessary control measures, appointing competent people and arranging for appropriate information and training.
Management	Management of Health and Safety at Work and Fire Precautions (Workplace) (Amendment) Regulations 2003/2457	These Regulations amended the Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999 and the Fire Precautions (Workplace) Regulations 1997.
Management	Workplace (Health, Safety and Welfare) Regulations 1992 (S.I. 1992/3004).	The Regulations protect the health and safety of everyone in the workplace, and ensure that adequate welfare facilities are provided for people at work.
Manual Handling	Manual Handling Operations Regulations 1992 (S.I. 1992/2793).	The Regulations implement European Directive 90/269/EEC on minimum health and safety requirements for the manual handling of loads where there is a risk particularly back injuries to workers.
Mines	Mines Regulations 2014 (S.I.2014/3248). (Primarily domestic provisions with some EU-derived requirements).	The Regulations relate to health and safety in mines for workers and others affected by mining activities, ensuring mine operators provide all the necessary protection for mine workers and others from the hazards inherent to mining.

Noise	Control of Noise at Work Regulations 2005 (S.I. 2005/1643).	The Regulations place a duty on employers to reduce the risk to their employees' health from exposure to noise at work.
Offshore	Offshore Installations and Pipeline Works (First-Aid) Regulations 1989 (S.I. 1989/1671).	The Regulations define the level of First-Aid provision that dutyholders should provide on offshore installations and pipeline works.
Offshore	The Offshore Installations and Pipeline Works (Management and Administration) Regulations 1995 (S.I. 1995/738)	The Regulations ensure safe management of offshore installations (fixed and mobile offshore installations, which may include wells and supplementary units).
Offshore	Offshore Installations (Prevention of Fire and Explosion, and Emergency Response) Regulations 1995 (S.I. 1995/743)	The Regulations provide requirements for the prevention of fire and explosions on offshore installations and protect the people on them should such an incident occur, including emergency response arrangements for evacuation, escape, rescue and recovery.
Offshore	Offshore Installations and Wells (Design and Construction, etc) Regulations 1996 (S.I. 1996/913)	The Regulations ensure the safety of wells operations both onshore and offshore.
Offshore	Offshore Installations (Safety Case) Regulations 2005 (S.I. 2005/3117).	The Regulations relate to the health and safety of workers employed on installations within in shore waters or in connected activities. Safety Case 2015 Regulations now cover offshore waters (extended by Application Outside of Great Britain Order).
Offshore	Offshore Installations (Offshore Safety Directive) (Safety Case etc) Regulations 2015 (S.I. 2015/398).	The Regulations set out requirements for Safety Cases to ensure the health and safety of oil and gas operations on offshore installations within external waters (area extended by the Application Outside of Great Britain Order).
PPE	Personal Protective Equipment at Work Regulations 1992 (S.I. 1992/2966).	The Regulations require suitable Personal Protective Equipment to be provided to workers wherever there are risks to health and safety that cannot be adequately controlled in other ways.
PPE	Personal Protective	These amend the Personal Protective Equipment at Work Regulations 1992 ("PPER

	Equipment at Work (Amendment) Regulations 2022 (S.I. 2022/8)	1992”) to extend the duties contained in regulations 4 to 11 of the PPER 1992 from employees to workers, and to update cross-references to other legislation
Quarries	Quarries Regulations 1999 (S.I. 1999/2024).	The Regulations provide protections for the health and safety of those working at quarries or affected by quarrying activities.
Radiation	Control of Artificial Optical Radiation at Work Regulations 2010 (S.I. 2010/1140).	The Regulations provide requirements for controlling worker exposure to artificial optical radiation.
Radiation	Control of Electromagnetic Fields at Work Regulations 2016 (S.I. 2016/588).	The Regulations provide requirements for controlling worker exposure to electromagnetic fields.
Radiation	The Ionising Radiations Regulations 2017 (S.I. 2017/1075).	The Regulations make provisions for ensuring the health risks to workers and others from exposure to ionising radiation are controlled.
Radiation	The Radiation (Emergency Preparedness and Public Information) Regulations 2019 (S.I. 2019/703)	The Regulations ensure that facilities with the potential for a radiation emergency and their Local Authority prepare, plan, and communicate with the public, in the event of a radiation emergency.
RIDDOR	Reporting of Injuries, Diseases and Dangerous Occurrences Regulations 2013 (S.I. 2013/1471).	The Regulations provide the national reporting framework for all sectors and workplaces in Great Britain, the purpose of which is to inform the Enforcing Authority (HSE or Local Authority) that an incident or event has occurred and to allow an appropriate regulatory response.
Sharp objects	Health and Safety (Sharp Instruments in Healthcare) Regulations 2013 (S.I. 2013/645).	The Regulations build on existing health and safety law and provide specific detail on the requirements for healthcare employers and their contractors to ensure that the risks from sharp injuries are adequately controlled.
Signs	Health and Safety (Safety Signs and Signals) Regulations 1996 (S.I. 1996/341)	The Regulations require employers to provide safety signs where other methods, properly considered, cannot deal satisfactorily with certain risks and where the use of a sign can further reduce that risk.
Vibration	Control of Vibration at Work Regulations 2005 (S.I. 2005/1093).	The Regulations aim to protect workers from risks to health from vibration. The regulations introduce action and limit values for hand-arm and whole-body vibration.

Workplace consultation	Safety Representatives and Safety Committees Regulations 1977 (S.I. 1977/500).	The Regulations provide for the establishment of safety committees and the recognition of trade union appointed safety representatives.
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Workplace consultation	Health and Safety (Consultation with Employees) Regulations 1996 (S.I. 1996/1513)	The Regulations require employers to consult on matters of health and safety to employees not represented by trade union appointed safety representatives under the Safety Representatives and Safety Committees Regulations 1977.
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
