#### Mission

To provide leadership for the UK's occupational hygiene professionals

#### Aims

- To continue to develop all levels of occupational hygiene practice, raising standards and accessibility and increasing the size and quality of the national occupational hygiene workforce.
- To provide technical, scientific, and non-technical skills-related tools, information and development opportunities for the occupational hygiene profession.
- To promote and support research in fields that support occupational hygiene knowledge and to engage in research projects where the Faculty is best-positioned and able to do so.
- To provide validated means by which those who cannot access occupational hygiene professionals to secure better workplace health protection.

## Mission, aims and vision

### Strategic Aims for 2026-2030

- To work inter-professionally and across disciplines and to provide leadership and advocacy for approaches to prevention in the context of workplace health.
- To work nationally and internationally in strategic partnerships to help secure better occupational hygiene practice.
- To implement, enhance and promote the Register of Occupational Hygiene Professionals and associated tools to enable transparency in the procurement of competent occupational hygiene practice.
- To further develop our role as a Professional Standards and Regulatory Body in the context of professional qualifications in occupational hygiene and related fields.

### **Vision**

That Occupational Hygiene services are accessible, high quality and provided by suitably qualified and competent individuals.

## Strategic Aims 2026-2030

- To anticipate, recognise and act upon opportunities and threats in the context of workplace health protection that arise from scientific, technological and regulatory change.
- To promote the value of the profession and occupational hygiene as a career and develop clear pathways into occupational hygiene for graduates and non-graduates, in order to increase the numbers in the profession.
- To design and implement a continuing professional development programme that supports the development of the occupational hygiene workforce and maintains Faculty membership numbers.
- To maintain and grow the services (e.g. the Directory of Occupational Hygiene Services, and complaints and feedback mechanisms) provided by the Faculty, so as to promote and support consistent good practice in all aspects of the provision of occupational hygiene.

**Strategic Aims for 2026-2030**

- To oversee the development of occupational hygiene tools which extend occupational hygiene knowledge and good practice beyond just the professional membership.
- To develop and enhance the technical and scientific base of the Society through research, publication and partnerships to broaden and deepen scientific insights and to share the benefits with members and the general public.
